Discussion Questions

1.) Throughout the bible there is a strong correlation between love for another human being and love for God. What are a few scriptures that come to your mind that make that correlation?

2.) What are a few things in life that you feel especially passionate about? How do you share your passion in these areas?

3.) At the heart of worship is the reality that it is first and foremost an expression of a relationship. Which of the three building blocks of relationship and worship do you find it easiest/hardest to express? The three are Intimacy, Commitment and Passion.

4.) The story of Cain and Abel is one of the first dialogues regarding worship. What learnings regarding worship do find in the struggle between Cain and Abel?

5.) In relationships as in worship, vulnerability creates a greater sense of intimacy. What ways could you increase your vulnerability in worship?

6.) The biblical story of David is a lesson in passionate living. He expressed his passion in an extramarital affair and also expressed his passion in heart felt worship. What lessons do you see in these behaviors that might help you develop passion in a healthy way in worship?

7.) How effective are you in watching over your heart? What kind of things get produced in the inner factory of your heart?

8.) Worship has much to do with being honest with our self. What do you see when you look into your own heart?

9.) What is God revealing about your heart that demands your honesty with yourself?

10.) What is one practical thing that you could do as a response to this message?
