"Conquering the Habitual" Discussion Questions

- 1.) What are a few of the things that you tend to do in a habitual way each day?
- 2.) Most people think of habits of being either good or bad. What benefits do you see in considering the benefits and drawbacks of habitual behavior?
- 3.) Can you recall a time when you found yourself playing hide and seek with God? When were you the one hiding? When were you the one seeking?
- 4.) We often think about worship as an act of seeking God. Consider what it means that God was the one seeking Adam and Eve in the garden.
- 5.) What do you think/feel about shady characters and foreigners being the first human beings to worship Jesus? Do these people fit your idea about who make for the best worshippers?
- 6.) Have you ever considered the fact that the religious leaders in the day of Jesus did not tag along on the journey to Bethlehem? Is there anything today that we can learn from their lack of curiosity?
- 7.) What do you think about the following two thoughts mentioned in today's message? The longer you walk with God the easier it is to become lazy in worship. The more you know of God the higher the tendency to become sluggish in worship.
- 8.) What would it mean for you to make a move in your worship of God?
- 9.) Do you think you have ever been focusing on biblical knowledge and have missed something God was trying to reveal to you?
- 10.) How do you plan on nourishing your curiosity and developing your expectation of what God is going to do new here in the Dillsburg congregation?
