Discussion Questions

1.) Wanderlust is defined as a strong innate desire to travel about. Is travel something you especially like or dislike? What’s the farthest you have traveled from home?

2.) In what personal ways have you applied Jesus’ words to go and make disciples?

3.) Do you envision the harvest field mentioned in scripture as close to home? What people come to mind when you think of God’s harvest field?

4.) Do you see yourself like the young girl in the biblical story - carrying hope with you wherever you go from day to day?

5.) Hope magnifies compassion. Where have you seen this truth lived out?

6.) When you offer hope to others do you have a clear sense of what you can do and what only God can do? Do you ever find yourself crossing that boundary?

7.) Some people like Namaan want help but want it only on their own terms. Have you seen this reality in any area of life where you have attempted to offer hope to another person?

8.) Do you have any illustrations whereby giving compassion has led to a person wanting to have a relationship with God?

9.) Where is God calling you to use your passport to adventure to serve him? Are you willing and able to follow?

10.) What is one practical thing that you could do as a response to this message?
