Discussion Questions**

1.) Have you ever done a border crossing? What comparison can you make between a border crossing and going through a transition in life?

2.) What are a few life transitions that you have experienced?

3.) What kind of things make transitions so hard to experience? What have you found to be the hardest part of transitions in your personal life?

4.) Read Isaiah 46 again and watch for the things that stand out to you as you read. Why do you think these things stood out to you?

5.) What kind of things have you put on your donkey as you have faced life transitions? Why do you think those things are so important to you?

6.) Take time to do a transition graph and list the kind of transitions that you have gone through in your life.

7.) Where have you seen God delivering you throughout life in the transitions you have faced?

8.) Using your birth and your death as bookends of your life, what would you like your life to communicate to those who are following you?

9.) One way of describing wisdom is the ability to see things in a grander perspective through the eyes of past, present and future. How might that help you as you face new transitions?

10.) What is one thing that you could do as a practical expression of this message?
