- According to NT scholar D. A. Carson, Herod the Great was ...
- Wealthy
- Politically shrewd
- Intensely loyal
- Excellent administrator

- Clever enough to remain in the good graces of successive Roman emperors.
- His famine relief was superb (24-23 B.C.)
- His building projects were admired even by his foes (including the Jewish Temple, which began construction in 20 B.C.).

- Loved power
- At times, inflicted incredibly heavy taxes on the people
- Confiscated wealth from political opponents
- Resented the fact that many Jews saw him as a usurper.

- Rises to power in 37 B.C.
- Dismisses first wife, Doris, and firstborn son, Antipater, in order to marry Mariamne, whom he loved.
- He had her grandfather and 17 year old brother killed.

- •By 29 B.C. Mariamne is accused of adultery and executed.
- A year later, Mariamne's mother is executed.
- One historian has noted that Herod's brother "escaped death only by dying."

- •Doris' side of family want back in power, so they convince Herod that his two sons to Mariamne are plotting against him.
- 7 B.C. they are convicted and executed.

- Antipater (Herod's firstborn son, whom he banished) can't wait for his turn to be king, so he plots to poison dad.
- Herod finds out and executes his most natural heir 5 days prior to his own death.
- His own funeral arrangements

- •In view of such executions, the emperor Augustus reportedly made a joke that "It is better to be Herod's pig than son" (Macrobius, *Saturnalia*, 2:4:11)
