<sup>18</sup> And God saw that it (sun, moon, and stars) was good. <sup>19</sup> And there was evening, and there was morning—the fourth day.

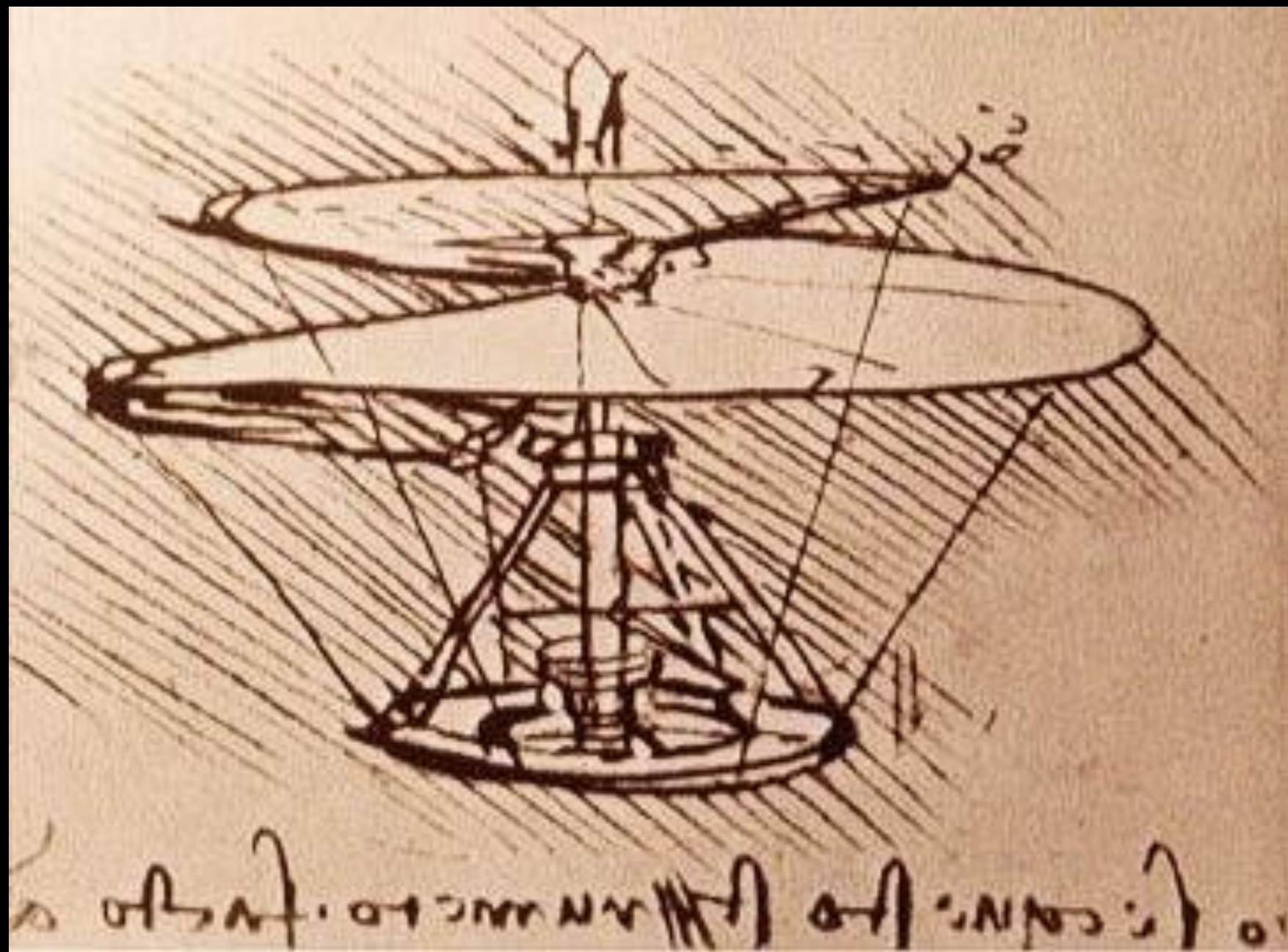
In speaking about sea and air creatures,
