Bookworking and the things I learn

Reading is one of my favorite activities. I remember learning on the old *Dick and Jane* books my teacher auntie gave us. Even after we could read for ourselves, my brother and I always loved it when Mother would read a chapter of a longer book to us in the evening before bedtime. During one period of my childhood, my mother limited my reading to only one Nancy Drew mystery each day—my friend across the alley had the whole series! My father would sometimes roll his eyes and quote from Ecclesiastes, "Of the making of books there is no end." During college I sometimes took a weekend to read something that was NOT required—just for the pure joy of it.

Anywhere I've lived, the local library has been a familiar place. When my brother and I started taking piano lessons, one of us would spend the other's lesson time across the street in the town library. Even Choma, Zambia, had a library, though it was 40 miles from our home at Macha. While we were in Africa, other people's bookshelves were always well-browsed for good possibilities. The advent of e-books and e-lending greatly expanded my bookshelf overseas, to my great satisfaction.

Our church library has also been a trove of riches. How I miss Harriet's article each month on what's new in our library! But I'm finding much in what's already there to feed my mind and heart.

Issues of *Christianity Today*, which I eagerly anticipate each month, help me learn about and pray for things that are happening in the church around the world. During planning for our summer missions emphasis on displaced persons, *CT's* June issue told about the Muslim communities around Detroit (where the Brethren in Christ currently have one missionary nurse), and the May issue gave a picture of Young Life's ministry on the southern border between El Paso and Juarez, where high schoolers walk across the

border each day to attend school. In an editorial comment, Andy Olsen wrote, that this is "the church doing its job, loving people wounded by the sharp edges of broken systems and societies and challenging them to obey Christ."

Books entertain, inform and challenge. Histories, mysteries and biographies are favorite genres. And then there are favorite authors, good writers. I read everything by Philip Yancey (Soul Survivor is my favorite) and Eric Metaxas (Bonhoeffer!). And, of course, all of the No.1 Ladies Detective Agency series set in Botswana. Our library carries books on theology and Christian living. James K A Smith writes in You Are What You Love, "Discipleship is a kind of immigration from the kingdom of darkness to the kingdom of God's beloved Son." What am I fleeing; what am I hoping for? Ann Voskamp challenged me with this from her latest book, The Broken Way: "Love is not always agreement with someone, but it is always a sacrifice for someone." And this, "You haven't loved until you've been inconvenienced."

Recently we had special prayer for the persecuted church, our brothers and sisters around the world for whom following Jesus is a risky pursuit. I thought about the novel by Randy Alcorn, *Safely Home*, that gives a very moving picture of such a situation in China. Maybe I'll read it again.

Stop Traffic By Sarah Hoover

One day Marj Strayer and I went out with the purpose of getting businesses to post the Human Trafficking Hotline number in windows and restrooms.

We had two goals in posting the hotline number:

To provide help or rescue to someone trapped in human trafficking
 To provide a resource for the community to report suspicions of human trafficking

We visited 18 businesses in Dillsburg that day. The majority of businesses said they would post the number and some even posted it right away while we were still in the store! Only a few had to get approval from corporate or regional managers.

At one business, the manager told us that when her daughter was 16, she was kidnapped and taken to New Orleans and advertised as a prostitute. The mother received help from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, and her daughter was located and rescued. We don't like to think of these types of things happening in Dillsburg, but human trafficking is everywhere.

Human trafficking can take many forms from the more obvious of men exploiting women and girls through strip clubs and prostitution to workers not being paid or being paid below minimum wage to parents selling their own children right out of their homes, along with many other scenarios.

Our small town is not excluded from these issues. Route 15 is a major pass-through road for human traffickers. Not only are traffickers stopping at our businesses as they pass through on route 15, but they are also living amongst us in our neighborhoods.

Studies have shown that most victims are rescued by a community member calling the hotline number or 911.

Here are some of the warning signs to look for in a victim of trafficking:

1.) Poor/overcrowded living conditions

2.) Unable to leave without an escort

3.) Neglect, malnutrition, physical abuse 4.) Young person romantically involved with an older individual

5.) In the commercial sex industry

6.) Not knowing what city/town they are in

7.) Protect their abuser

Madrid: Still waiting for the resources for that locale we want. We just found out this week that the reason it's not selling is because people think it's haunted! We can deal with that! Maybe they'll bring the price down even further? Keep praying!

Hoyo: Antonio and a small group continues to go out and pray for people on the streets for healing. Most do get healed, and there have been at least a dozen who have opened their hearts to Jesus. Pray that the church could remain in contact with these folks, so that they can be discipled. Most are given information. None have made it to the Hoyo church.

Sierra Oeste: In the last year, this church plant started by OMS missionaries has been hit by a lot of discouragement among



its leadership. Pray, not only for the leaders, Sergio, Annette, Leo and Antonio, but for the members who have lost interest in the house churches. Chris and Kara are now part of this congregation and have initiated a new young adult's group in the last week.

Figueres, frontier town with France, is our newest addition, started by the BIC Honduran church. Jairo and Jhajaira and their family could use your prayers. Jairo needs residency and a steady job. The church is growing and now has its own storefront. Praise God!

One last bit of news: We took in a Christian couple from Guatemala in the last month. Manuel is from Spain, but his wife Patricia is from Guatemala. They lost everything in the volcano earlier this year. I won't go into their story for it's quite long, but they are proving to be a huge blessing to the church community. They left their two teenage children in Guatemala, and are very concerned for them. Manuel needs to find employment. Patricia has been filling in for Paulette, who had to travel urgently to Chile to be with her ailing mother who passed away on Monday. They are staying with us until they can find employment and be able to rent a room. Pray for Manuel, Patricia and Paulette, who are going through some rough times right now.
