The pastors keep their own schedules, so contact them directly if you would like to meet with one of them. It is our goal to make the office available to anyone who needs to use the equipment or work with the administrative assistant as we begin to carefully resume activities at the church. We also want to ensure that we protect the congregation members and staff from illness by maintaining social distancing and sanitizing between visits to the extent it is feasible.

We will be holding prayer every Saturday night at 7 pm. We will model it after 2 Chronicles 7:14. This is a time for corporate prayer and seeking God's face. We will meet outside weather permitting. If it is bad weather we will meet in B1 and at this point in time, face masks will be required when meeting inside.
