Breakfast Conversations By Naomi Smith

Our family has a tradition of eating a special breakfast together on Saturday mornings. On these occasions, Jason is the head cook and the kids are his capable assistants. Reuben grinds the coffee beans, Gloria cooks the bacon, and Miriam sets out the maple syrup. Pancakes are often on the menu, but we also enjoy French toast, waffles, and crepes we sprinkle with lemon juice and powdered sugar. This year our breakfasts have included a friend's homemade apple butter, Nana's rhubarb sauce, and sweet strawberries that Jason grows in the Milton Hershey School hydroponic greenhouse.

I deeply appreciate the gift of this delicious food, but my favorite part comes after the meal, when the coffee cups have been emptied and the Nutella spoon has been licked clean. More often than not, Saturday breakfasts are our time to linger together, to allow our thoughts and emotions to seep out after the hustle and bustle of the week. Sometimes we will read a Psalm or the next page of a devotional book. Other times we will ask an open-ended question. What's on your bucket list? What do you wonder about? How do you feel about this situation? What does God say about this?

As I look back over years of Saturday breakfast conversations, I recognize these for the holy ground that they are. In this space, we have processed difficult realities and articulated precious hopes. We have wrestled with differing family cultures and firmed up theological foundations. In this space, everyone's voice matters. We work hard at making room for sadness and anger. Sometimes we get riled up over inconsequential things-for example, we recently had an argument about how many things is "a few." The fight may have been silly, but the words were weighty, and we learned a valuable lesson about how to treat one another when we disagree.

In the Gospels, lots of good, hard conversations happen around meals. Jesus is a lingerer, unafraid of taking his time and allowing a discussion to unfold as it will. He steers the conversation toward what matters most, but he does not weigh in on every point of contention in his world (or ours). Instead, Jesus models a way of being in the world. He asks questions; he tells stories; he persists in getting to the heart of things. Jesus doesn't defend

himself, but he does defend the dignity of the outcast. He remains grounded in Scripture but also sensitive to the Spirit.

Jesus' approach to discipleship appears to be more about proximity than program, more about life lived together than a list of topics to cover. As much as I love the Bible studies, Sunday School classes, and other intentional discipleship endeavors of the body of Christ, they only represent part of what Jesus offers to his friends. He also provides Saturday morning breakfasts: unhurried hours, honest conversations, and room to make mistakes.

The ministry leaders of our church have been pondering what it would look like to encourage intentional friendships in and outside of our congregation. We recognize that—like Jesus' model of discipleship—this needs to be more about proximity than program. How do we facilitate the building of genuine friendships with one another? How do we cultivate relationships with our unchurched neighbors? How do we make space for connection?

If you have ideas or insights to share, feel free to talk to me or any of the ministry leaders. While we ponder this together, my hope is that you will have the courage to reach out to someone soon and say, "How about breakfast?" You never know where the conversation may lead. :)



Reminder: Worship Services begin at 10:00am in our green space.

Please feel free to bring a comfortable chair or blanket to sit on! Leadership Council has decided that people do not need to wear masks for our outdoor gatherings. However, people should absolutely feel free to continue wearing masks if they want. Additionally, on Sundays when we move worship inside, the Fellowship Hall will be a mask-optional space, the Sanctuary will be mask-optional for vaccinated people, and the Orange Room will require masks. What may help in keeping the present policies clear is to think of each of the floors of the building going from the most restrictive in the basement to the least restrictive in the fellowship hall. We have also increased the sanctuary limit to 100 in attendance. When people gather for meetings inside the church building, the sanctuary policy will be in effect, which means that masks are optional for those who are vaccinated.
