### "God is Faithful"

One book, among many, we have reflected on this year is "Where All Hope Lies" by James R. Van Tholen. It is a collection of sermons for the liturgical year compiled by friends and family after the preacher died of cancer at age 36.

The title page of the book features this verse: "May God Himself, the God of peace, sanctify you through and through. May your whole Spirit, Soul, and Body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. The One who calls you is faithful, and He will do it." (1 Thess. 5:23 -24)

What does it mean that God is Faithful? How will He "Do It"? What is He doing anyway? Where is He keeping His promises?

As we have struggled in recent years with loss, disappointment, discouragement, and weariness, these questions dangle in our hearts like burned-out Christmas lights. Yet, we do believe, beyond any doubt, that God is Faithful. He cannot lie; He is True to His Word, and He keeps His promises.

Faithfulness in our life together, to me, means we depend on God in our weakness to keep us close to His heart, and as we continue to say "Yes" to Him, He provides what we need. We wish this meant that we wouldn't suffer, wouldn't have doubts, wouldn't be betrayed or battered or bereft. But this desert is where we learn real dependence on Him; this dry, arid place; this sacred space of walking.

Lydia Horst wrote a precious note to Carolyn (Kimmel) that was read at her bedside, and it speaks so well to all of us. She penned, "... we do not know the future, but God does, and He will do what is right."

Yes, in spite of cancer, He does what is right. And because of His promise that "cancer will not have the last word," it did not! Not for Gary (Lebo) or Carolyn or the many others who have been taken by this horrible disease. All the promises of God are "Yes" in Jesus Christ, and because of Him, death is defeated and we can have Hope!

And yet we grieve these empty spaces in our lives; these precious friends and family taken too soon. Much too soon....

We were reminded last month by Anne-Marie's article to think about "What's Next."


Maybe next we see our journey together in new ways; maybe we remember what is really important and let go of what is not; maybe we listen to God's heartbeat - the steady, constant life blood of His purposes and grace.

It is comforting to not need to have all the answers because He does, and as He continues to walk with us in our weakness, we know His faithfulness.

After having been in the hospital for four days, I knew this all was not just happenstance. ### **Evil Has A Name**

"Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour." (1 Peter 5:8)

Satan prefers that we do not recognize his role in our conflicts. As long as we see other people as our only adversaries and focus our attacks on them, we will give no thought to guarding against our most dangerous enemy. Both James and Peter were aware of this danger, and they warn us to actively resist Satan's schemes (James 4:7; 1 Peter 5:9). Paul gives a similar warning, reminding us that "our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms" (Eph. 6:12).

### Who is your most dangerous enemy?

Think about it for a moment. What would you say? Odds are that among both non-Christians and Christians, most of us would answer in terms of flesh and blood; in other words, someone or some group of people. But as Ken reminds us, that's just not the case. Three scriptural authors -- Peter, James and Paul -- all echo the reality that our most dangerous enemy in this life is Satan.

There is an enemy out there and we're basically oblivious to his schemes - we're asleep at the wheel. We just keep on blaming each one another, a.k.a., flesh and blood, for everything that's going on. Ken says it well: Satan prefers that we do not recognize his role in our conflicts.

If we have any intention of living as peacemakers, it's imperative that we live with an awareness of our most dangerous enemy. Now it is true that most of our struggle comes through flesh and blood, but we've got to be self-controlled and alert, remembering that it's not ultimately against flesh and blood that we battle.


