"Footwashing as Transformed Friendship" By Esther Spurrier

Rob recently preached about the woman who showed her gratitude, love and devotion by washing and anointing the feet of Jesus, drying them with her hair. We also have an opportunity to wash the feet of Jesus every year at the Maundy Thursday supper and service, just before Easter. The love and devotion we show to others is love and devotion given to Jesus.

The tradition of footwashing started long ago in Brethren in Christ churches because Jesus said in John 13 that just as he washed the feet of his disciples (even Judas!) the night before his crucifixion, we also ought to wash each other's feet. Our forebears took this very literally. Their descendants have not always practiced this act of humility and service quite so literally. Some have found meaningful equivalent practices; others have stopped trying.

Ever since I was a little girl, I have loved the footwashing service. In no other group worship activity have I found such expression of love and intimacy. I remember our fellowship at DBIC in the 1990s. The women washed feet in the basement. Maybe some of you can even today recall the musty smell of that old space! Bared feet didn't hold a candle to that smell. But such love was expressed as we sat in a circle, our young daughters present and participating with us, singing, sharing memories and testimonies, watching and praying, then being washed, washing, sharing words of love and blessing as we exchanged a "holy kiss."



We returned to Zambia after the millennium rolled over and found a rampant AIDS pandemic that was changing life and service in dire ways. The there church was reconsidering whether to continue its practice of footwashing. Feet and hands are used hard in that society. There were often cuts and open sores that increased the risk of transmitting the HIV virus

as we washed each other's feet. But the elders decided that this practice of showing love and humble service to each other was worth the risk, and so we continued. We did add a basin of hand-washing water laced with bleach afterwards as an effective safeguard.

As I get older, the physical challenge of getting down gracefully on my knees and back up again is greater. But there are always loving hands to help me, or ways to adapt the desire of my heart to my physical capabilities!

Jesus didn't just tell us how we can love and serve each other; he showed us. And then he told us to turn around and practice it. It's wonderful to welcome young ones and first-timers into the Maundy Thursday observance. We help each other as part of our act of humble service. If you've never participated in this aspect of the Lenten season, welcome to the footwashing circle.



Ramadan

The Islamic holy month of prayer begins March 10. Global Outreach has purchased a number of copies of a prayer guide you can use as we pray for Muslim people to "come home" to Jesus. International Mission Board also publishes a brief on-line prayer guide you can access at the website at the bottom of the page. This is the introduction to that guide:



Let's pray during Ramadan

Every year billions of Muslims observe a month-

long fast from sunrise to sundown called Ramadan, one of the pillars of Islam. For many, it's tradition and an anticipated time to share with families and communities. For other Muslims, Ramadan is about selfdenial or overcoming evil desires and appetites, renewing vows to live a moral life, reading the Qur'an again, extra times of prayer, and performing acts of charity. But religious duties like Ramadan cannot solve our greatest problem: humanity's sinful rebellion against a holy God. The good news of Jesus is largely unknown among Muslims. As Muslims observe Ramadan, may we, the Church, pray to the one, true God for their salvation. Their greatest problem, even in their season of prayer, remains spiritual lostness. Like us, they need the only solution—the gospel. Pray this month for Muslims' response to the gospel and for missionaries who daily serve among them. Our God is listening!

God hears our prayers

During Ramadan 2007, in such a time of heightened spiritual awareness among Muslims, workers asked us to pray for Chief Moses. He leads a village of Wassulu people in West Africa. After having a dream about Jesus, Chief Moses began studying the Bible, but he was unwilling to leave Islam. For the past two decades, Chief Moses has been a friend to workers among the Wassulu and has heard the gospel many times. When his health rapidly declined in January 2023, workers visited him and walked through the gospel with him again. With deep joy and awe, they listened as Chief Moses's life! God answered the prayers we said during Ramadan over a decade ago. This Ramadan, join us in asking God to move in incredible ways once again. Your prayers will have a direct impact on our hope to see a multitude from every nation, tribe, people, and language knowing and worshiping our Lord Jesus Christ (Revelation 7:9).

I had the opportunity to serve as the administrative assistant to the General Secretary of BIC National and then to serve for ten years as associate pastor at DBIC.

God walked so closely with me during that time and brought me from the very depths of despair to a community of believers here at DBIC who walked that journey alongside me and allowed me to heal and find value and purpose. Being with my family in Dillsburg provided a foundation for that healing.

Being a listener and prayer warrior.

I spend my free time doing...

The volunteer work I mentioned above. I love gardening, but I have been dealing with some challenges physically that limit my ability to enjoy being out working in the yard. I do have opportunity to occasionally care for my granddaughter, Charlie, and that is an incredible blessing.

Favorite Bible verse...

Isaiah 40:28-31. How I would love to soar on the wings of eagles. This has been my favorite passage for many years, but has come to mean so much more to me over the last few years as my mobility has become more and more compromised.

I love the people and the way that serving the community inside and outside of DBIC is so important. I've watched community outreach increase over the years and have been so blessed by the desire of the congregation to reach out beyond the four walls of the church.
