"Family Promise—More than just a bed to sleep!"

Family Promise Harrisburg Capital Region (FPHCR) has been part of Dillsburg BIC since it opened its doors in 2010. Countless men, women, and children from our congregation have shared a meal, joined in play, had conversations, provided transportation, and slept overnight so that families facing the challenges of homelessness could receive a "hand-up." This ministry could not exist without the incredible volunteers from DBIC.

We interact with one to three families that stay at DBIC three to four times a year, but there are many more families and individuals who find hope through the programs, partnerships, and genuine compassion and care of the staff at Family Promise. Their focus continues to be on families they can bring into the Interfaith Hospitality Network (IHN), but their reach extends far beyond that. The staff at Family Promise continues to reach out to families after they have graduated from the program, as well as to provide assistance to all those individuals who connect with Family Promise. They do not simply answer a phone call; they ask questions and provide as many resources as possible so that those going through extraordinarily difficult times have a glimmer of hope on their journey.

Family Promise continues to grow in order to make a greater impact on homelessness in Central Pennsylvania. Currently, they offer programs such as Move UP, Wheels UP, and Heads UP. Move UP provides funding for rental and security deposits to help folks avoid homelessness or, if they are homeless, to get back into housing. Wheels UP provides funds for car repairs and purchases, while Heads UP offers an opportunity to receive mental health support. All of these programs are designed to assist individuals in avoiding the difficult journey of homelessness. The staff has also diligently reached out to other organizations and agencies to provide as much information and help as possible to those connecting with Family Promise.

Over the last few years, Family Promise has partnered



with the United Way in the Road to Success program. Road to Success provides an opportunity for individuals to develop resumes and connect with job opportunities that can support their future. They currently serve as a case management site, providing workforce development and removing barriers that prevent successful employment.

I've had the opportunity to be personally involved with Family Promise over the last fourteen years. This involvement has allowed me to serve as a volunteer leader and then as a volunteer at DBIC, where I've acted as an evening host, overnight host, van driver, set-up crew member, and food provider. I've also had the opportunity to serve FPHCR as a board member, board president, and chairman of various committees. I continue to serve as a board member, and over the last year, I have been volunteering, answering phones, and connecting firsthand with individuals who are navigating a journey they never anticipated. This experience has fostered a deep compassion for those in need of the "hand-up" that Family Promise provides, as well as a profound respect for the FPHCR staff, board, consultants, host churches, volunteers, and donors.

The goal of Family Promise is not just to provide shelter but also to offer the resources that can lead to success for families and individuals in avoiding or emerging from homelessness. Their mission is to transform the lives of those experiencing homelessness because every child deserves a home.

Messiah University Collaboratory

On Saturday November 2nd at 10 A.M. in the fellowship hall, we will have a presentation including demonstrations by people from our church who have participated in The Collaboratory at Messiah University, including:

Tim Van Dyke – he has been involved in various projects within the Collaboratory over the years. The most recent one and one which is a good example of the type of work we do in the Collaboratory is the Nepal Wheelchair project. This project focuses on designing wheelchairs for a hospital in Pokhara, Nepal, using locally available materials and tools, making it more affordable and easier to repair. We have worked for a number of years on a wheelchair which we have been able to design and to build successfully in Nepal. We now are working on designing a standing version of the wheelchair which will assist more-abled users in going from a sitting to a standing position. I have taken three trips with students to Nepal to work on this and other projects, collaborating closely with hospital staff. While in Nepal, we have attended Nepali churches in order to be able to connect with the local Nepali believers.

Ray Knepper he volunteers in the Collaboratory with Professor Michelle Lockwood and the CAWS Team (Clean Assessable Water Solutions) where we develop methods to provide safe drinking water to communities in developing countries. Based on the tested water, we design our systems using different methodology, including ozone oxidation, ultraviolet radiation and chlorine. The Team develops and tests the system for a particular need, then travels to the country and installs the system, educating the clients on its use and how to maintain the system. Sustainability by the client is important to the long-term success of the project.

Randy Fish – over the years he has been involved with students attempting to provide access to clean water and reliable electricity. Those projects have brought me to Burkina Faso, Ghana, Kenya, Zambia and Zimbabwe. My most recent work has been on a system which reports to maintenance staff when a hand pump has broken down or when it is in need of maintenance. In May, I traveled with a team of students to Zambia to install prototypes of this system that I'll be talking about in November.

An update on our survivors from Rebecca, our Care Coordinator:

It's been another full month for our Care Team and survivors! After months of working hard, we tried to add some extra fun things in September to take advantage of the fall weather and activities. It's been a month of growth for our survivors with a bit of fun mixed in too.

The women continue to work through their goals and life skills classes - we had a treat last week as one of the past women we helped was in town for a visit and came to therapy group to chat with us.

We have also seen some fruit come from relationships that we have been cultivating. We have been doing outreach at a clinic in Harrisburg for months, and last week they contacted us to come and help a woman who walked in off the street. We worked to get her safely to a vehicle and with help from JFT Recovery and Veterans Support Services, got her into rehab that day. We will be ready to support her in her next steps when she returns. We also have some other outreach opportunities in the works that we hope to share with you in the future..

Some highlights:

- We were able to provide a new experience for one our "Peace Promise kids" - he went kayaking with the Kipe family and Patty at Gifford Pinchot.
- There were opportunities to further our positive interaction with law enforcement! This is huge for our survivors who are learning how to build relationships with safe people.
- We enjoyed helping to throw a birthday party for two of the children we support
- Some of the women spent an evening at my house for dinner and s'mores. Building relationships with our survivors is one of the best parts of the job!

Our ladies are growing and we know this wouldn't be possible without the support of our community. Thank you for being part of their journey.

The church nursery is open during the 10:00 a.m. worship service for children ages 0-4 (any kids not yet in kindergarten). You can sign in your children in the nursery room (next to the library) and pick them up after the service.

(Meeting time shared as needed to protect privacy) Do you want support in your efforts to love your child and have a good relationship with them? Do you have questions or fears about your child's future? Are you questioning your parenting? We are not trying to change your child, the church, or the world. We are here to support and honor each other in our efforts as parents who love their LGBTQ+ children.
